We have been thinking about our mental health this week during Mental Health Week. Please ask your children what they have discussed in class.



Internet Safety

It was internet safety day this week. The children discussed keeping safe online and made posters to help them to remember.

Top Tips for Parents and Carers: Have a look at the tips and links below with some suggestions on how to get you started.

You and your family can #PlayYourPart in creating a better internet by:

• Having conversations without judgement: whether by playing games, watching videos, or doing things your child enjoys, spending time together online is a great way to start conversations about the online world and how they're finding being a



part of it. It is important to ask questions and take an interest in what your child enjoys online. An essential part of having this open dialogue is to not judge, even if their behaviour or life online isn't what you wanted or expected. This ensures that your child feels they can come to you if ever they make a mistake or experience a problem online.

- Knowing where you can learn more about their favourite apps and games: websites like Common Sense Media or The Family Gaming Data-base can be invaluable sources of information. When your child starts talking about a new game or app, why not do some research into the reporting and blocking options available? Then you can help your child if they come to you with an issue.
- **Getting support if things go wrong:** there are lots of organisations who are there to support you and your family if something has gone wrong. The Report Harmful Content website can help you with issues such as cyberbullying, impersonation and threats. You can report worrying behaviour towards children to CEOP. Find out more on Childnet's Get Help page.
- Reassuring your child that whatever happens online, you are there to support them: let your child know that the best way to address any problem they have online, is to tell a trusted adult immediately. For example, this might include someone sending them a friend request; an online message; telling them to visit a specific website, or app; or asking them for their personal information. Reassure them that if anything happens online that online that they are unsure about, or makes them feel worried or upset, they can come to you for help.



Governor Profile

Chair of Governors—Judith Randell-Sly

Chair of Governors for the joint governing body of William Morris and Badbury Park Primary Schools

Prior to the opening of Badbury Park and William Morris primary schools, in 2019, I was asked to join the Governing Body as Chair. I had previously been Chair of the Blue Kite Trust and before that had been on the Governing Bodies of two other schools and was Chair of one for several years. As a member of the BKT I was involved in the setting up of the two schools from the earliest stage and so am familiar with their journeys from inception to opening and beyond.

Sunflowers and Bellflowers have been super busy the last two weeks with lots of learning! We read the story 'What the Ladybird heard' and the Ladybird came to visit us in our classroom! She brought us the book and lots of minibeast friends. We have learnt some interesting facts about minibeasts and why they are called minibeasts. To help the Ladybird from the story we drew a picture of our favourite minibeast and had ago at labelling it and some of us wrote a simple sentence.

We celebrated Chinese New Year on Tuesday 1st February. We enjoyed making our own lanterns, Chinese dragons and having ago at writing our numbers in Chinese writing. We enjoyed listening to the story of Chinese New Year and watching how it is celebrated. We talked about similarities and differences to how we celebrate our own New Year.

In Maths we have been exploring combining two groups together to find the total. We started the week by using two groups of objects and finding how many we had altogether. Once we had mastered this, we used numicon and dominos to combine two groups where the children also used their subitising skills.

Next week we are looking forward to our final week about 'Our World' and exploring space! Don't forget its **Space Day on Monday 14**th **February (don't forget your space outfit)** and World storytelling week.

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Year 1

What a busy couple of weeks we have had in Year 1. After lots of people being away, it has been lovely to all come back together and really get stuck into our topic—Superheroes.

In English we have been learning the story Charlie's Superhero Underpants. We have learnt actions to the story and the children are absolutely amazing at retelling it. In the last week we have begun creating our own stories based on this and we are now going to begin to write these.

In Maths we have been thinking about ordering numbers from biggest to smallest and smallest to biggest. We have also been comparing numbers by recognising which number is less or more than another number. We have continued with our focus on measuring and have been thinking about taller or shorter.

We have been having lots of fun in our topic lessons, we have been discovering which super powers we have inside ourselves! We have been investigating our senses and seeing how much we can rely on one sense at a time. The children absolutely loved it when we had to use the sense of taste to figure out what was on the spoon :)

We've then looked at the rhyme George chants whilst making his marvellous medicine and thinking about rhyming and nonsense words.




