Covid 19 Reminder

Please see the guidance below taken from https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/. If your child or anyone in your household has 1 or more of the symptoms below (including if they just have a temperature), please do not send your child into school and book a test or seek medical advice if unsure by calling 111 or your GP. Thank you for your co-operation.

Check if you or your child has coronavirus symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result.

Main symptoms

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

- 1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
- You and anyone you live with should stay at home and not have visitors until you get your test result – only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone in your support bubble should also stay at home if you have been in close contact with them since your symptoms started or during the 48 hours before they started.

Year 1 Tulip Class

Year 1 have had a brilliant start to Term 2! We have welcomed new children and a new teacher (Miss Morgan) to our class over the last few weeks, who have all made a fantastic start. All of the children have settled into their new routines and have done some excellent learning too. We enjoyed Odd Socks Day and Children in Need over the last few weeks where we learned about Anti-Bullying and how we can support others through charitable work.

The children have loved their new topic 'Frozen Planet'. Rescuing a penguin that was frozen in ice and sipping hot chocolate whilst learning about the penguins of the Antarctic have been their highlights so far! We have learned lots about the equator and how the Earth is hot and cold in different places. The children are now able to identify where these places are on a globe and a world map.

In English, we have been learning about the story 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers. We are currently writing our own innovated stories using the book to help us do this. The penguin that has lost its way has been changed into a different animal in each of the stories that the children are writing. In Maths, we have started looking at numbers up to 30 and the children have been able to count, compare and order these numbers. We've also started to look at a few different shapes. So far, we've identified rectangles by looking at their properties and this week we've identified a very special rectangle called ... a square!

Thank you for reading at home and posting pictures of reading records on ILD so we can see what you have been learning about, it is appreciated. Please ensure that your book is returned on a Monday each week so that we can send out a new book on a Friday. The children are trying extremely hard with their learning and are impressing us with their attitude towards their work. Really well-done Tulip Class!
