ADHD awareness month



October is ADHD awareness month across the world. As such, this week we have had a whole school assembly about ADHD and how we can support and accept the children in our school who might have difficulties with attention and impulse control.

“Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) is a group of behavioural symptoms that include...

- **Inattention:** Easily distracted, poor concentration skills, difficulty organising themselves
 - **Impulsivity:** Impatient, risk-taking, disproportionately emotional responses
- Hyperactivity:** Overly energetic, talkative, excessive fidgeting, difficulty staying on task

Everyone is different, so it isn't uncommon for two people to experience ADHD in different ways.”

What have we been learning in Nursery?

What have we been learning in Reception?



Our English focus this week has been 'The Squirrels Who Squabbled'. The children were so excited when a letter arrived from the Squirrels, asking for their help! The children have helped prepare a party list and invitations for the characters from the story, practising hearing and writing initial sounds and CVC words,

In Maths we have been making number collections, showing the different ways we can represent 5. We have also had lots of fun practising our subitising skills playing games such as dominoes, connect four and other simple dice games.

As well as enjoying our focus story, this week we have been talking about Autumn, the children have created some beautiful artwork using leaves for printing and enjoyed carrying out observational drawings of pumpkins and squashes.

How You Can Support at Home:

- **Autumn:** Go on a welly walk and look for signs of autumn.
- **Name writing:** Support your child to practise writing their name.
- **Phonics home learning:** Please revise the sounds that have been taught at school.

Subitising: Support your child with subitising dice patterns by playing simple board games with dice e.g. snakes and ladders.

Reminders:

- Please ensure your child's yellow reading record and school books are in their bookbag every day.
- Please ensure your child brings a coat with them to school every day.
- Please return your child's library book every Friday so that we can change them during our library time.
- At the end of the school day please do not allow children to use or play with the equipment in the outside area.

What have we been learning in Year 1?



The children in Year 1 have had a busy few weeks! Thank you for attending parents evening last week, it was lovely to speak to you all to discuss how your child is getting on.

Last week we had a fabulous time on our trip at Westonbirt and where we looked at deciduous and ever-green trees, We explored the changes of trees over the season and talk about how trees grow. We had lunch altogether, collected leaves, sticks and other natural objects to bring back to class to use in our art area. We enjoyed going on the Gruffalo walk and finding all of the characters.

English: Last week after our trip, we came back and wrote a recount about what we did in Westonbirt. We tried really hard and thought carefully about what we wanted to write.

Maths: In maths we have been looking at adding and subtracting, looking at facts for number 5 and 6 when making our calculations.

Topic: We have created lots of natural art using different media. The children have practiced mixing colours to make new colours and have been painting woodland animals.

Science: This week has been using our pots to plant our own cress monsters, we are very excited to see when they grow and how much they grow.

Computing: We have continued with our online safety topic. The children have practiced logging in, once logged in, the children went on '2 count' and where we explored adding on to a chart and making our charts represent an amount.

What have we been learning in Year 2?



This week in **English**, the children have dived into the wonderful world of poetry! They crafted some fantastic acrostic poems about our classrooms, showing their creativity and unique perspectives. Throughout the week, we explored various types of poetry, with a special focus on performance poetry. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about its different features and that poetry can be performed anywhere. It's been a week full of inspiration and expression, and we're very proud of their wonderful creations.

In **Maths**, we have been exploring 3D shapes and their properties, focusing on vertices, edges, and faces. We have enjoyed identifying different shapes, such as cubes, spheres, and pyramids, and discussing their unique characteristics. We've even created our own 3D shapes using cocktail sticks and polystyrene balls to deepen our understanding. Alongside this, we've started to look at various methods for addition, including using number lines and regrouping to help visualise the process. All of Year 2 have been fabulous mathematicians!

In **Art**, we wrapped up our "Muck, Mess, and Mixtures" topic by using the skills we developed to create vibrant collages. We had a great time experimenting with various materials like tissue paper, coloured card, and paper, along with different pens and paints.

We are looking forward to the last few days of term next week, and are looking forward to seeing you all at Open House next week!

What have we been learning in Year 3?



What a fantastic two weeks it has been gain in year 3! We've been happy to 'get back to normal' with our timetable and settle back in to our normal structure for the day. It's been an exciting few weeks with poetry day and our World record breaking attempt at the world's biggest ever poetry lesson and we joined an online assembly about Black History month with over 300,000 children!

We have been learning in class assembly about Black History month and compared the stories of two explorers; Niel Armstrong and Matther Henson who respectively traveled to the North pole and the Moon before anyone else. We talked in class about why we may know more about one explorer than the other.

In Maths, we have now finished our place value unit and moved on to geometry. The children have really enjoyed learning all the basics of vertical, horizontal and parallel lines. Test us on your walks to see what lines we can spot in the local area. Next term we move on to multiplication starting with our 3 times tables.

In Writing, we have been designing a character and setting for our character to enter. We have then used these ideas to create a setting description part of a narrative focusing on skill such as expanded noun phrases, adverbs and powerful vocabulary to create a clear picture in the readers mind when they read our work.

We've had a very creative week where we designed and made some stone age tools out clay and we also came up with our own games in PE based on Netball rules. It has been lovely to see how creative and imaginative the children can be in these sessions and also some amazing teamwork!

We will be sending home the children's Purple Mash log in details, which is a platform we use to support learning in Computing and other subjects. We have focused on learning how to log in this term, and we would be grateful if you could practice this at home in order to allow better use of our computing session times.

What have we been learning in Year 4?



The last two weeks, we have been linking our English work to our topic by writing character descriptions for the fierce Queen Boudica! We looked at a model description and used it to draw how we imagined Boudica to look by picking out some of the key vocabulary. We then really enjoyed posing like the warrior queen and thinking about how her personality is shown through her image. Before we could describe her ourselves, it was important to hear her story. We read the story of Boudica and then used drama to retell the story. See if you can spot some of our battle scenes through our freeze frame photos. Then, after learning how to use similes, personification and metaphors to describe a character, we had a go at writing our own brilliant descriptions of Boudica—they really are very powerful descriptions.

In Maths, we finished our number unit by rounding 4-digit number to the nearest thousand. This is something that we can keep circling back to and practising throughout the year. We also linked some of our maths to our topic too, learning the Roman numerals up to 100. Although challenging, we had real fun cracking the Roman code! We have now moved onto our geometry unit, identifying different shapes including different types of triangles and quadrilaterals like a kite, rhombus, parallelogram and a trapezium.

As we near the end of our I am Warrior topic, we have looked further into how life would have been for a Roman child. We learn all about how their day to day would have looked, including what they would have eaten, what clothes they would have worn and even their religious beliefs. We did a great job at pulling all this information together to write a diary entry from the perspective of a Roman child. We have also enjoyed some great art lessons including one where we looked at different landmarks in Rome and sketched them such as the Colosseum and the pantheon.

We are looking forward to showing you all this amazing work at Open House next Wednesday from 2pm.

What have we been learning in Year 5?



Week 7

This term has flown by so quickly, and we've had such an incredible journey exploring the wonders of Ancient Egypt! The children have produced some truly impressive work, starting with a diary entry and then crafting detailed instructions on how to build a pyramid. Their efforts have amazed us! In addition, we've created stunning two-page spreads that highlight the significance of the River Nile and the mighty Pharaohs. This week, we dove into the fascinating world of Egyptian beliefs about the afterlife, with the children creating storyboards to illustrate their ideas. The Egyptians even took part in the symbolic 'weighing of the heart,' where they decided who would pass into the afterlife.

Cooking

As part of our exploration of Ancient Egypt, we had the exciting opportunity to bake traditional Egyptian flatbread—just like the kind they would have eaten! Following each step carefully, we kneaded the dough, let it prove, and finally got to enjoy the delicious result. The taste was a big hit, and some of us even took the recipe home to make it again as a tasty snack.



Science

In Science this week, the children explored the concept of levers. Using classroom resources, they built their own levers and experimented by adjusting the position of the fulcrum to observe how it influenced the lever's function. Take a look at the pictures below to see them in action...
