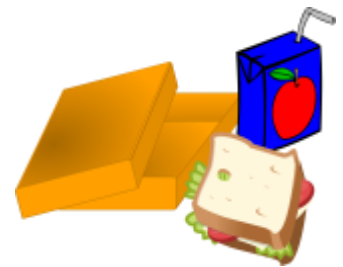

Sing, Play, Read!

This term we have been running Maths sessions with a few parents of nursery children. Each week we have read a book and completed a follow up activity linked to the text. The children and parents work together, and the course aims to help parents feel more confident to talk about maths with their children. We finished this week with a finger painting activity and the children loved it. Thanks so much to all parents who attended, we had positive feedback about how much they enjoyed the five sessions.





Dear Parents and Carers,

I wanted to take this opportunity to give all parents/carers some more information about OPAL and how it is going. In a word, brilliant! The children are continuing to surprise us with their innovative play and their creative ways to use the resources that are available to them. We feel play is extremely important to our children. On average, children in the UK **spend 231 hours per year at play** equating to around 1.4 years by the time they have left primary school, the only other things they spend this much time on in school are Maths and English. This is one of the reasons why we have adopted the OPAL programme and why we have given it such a high profile in our school as it is so important to our pupils' development.

I would like to inform you all about how the programme works in school and the way in which we **manage risks** and teach the children to manage their own risks. As part of the OAPL programme, we are trained on and use the RAPID system, which stands for Risk benefit approach, Assemblies focused on playtime, Policy for Play, Inspection and Dynamic risk management.

This means in school we assess the risk and identify the benefits of a type of play or piece of equipment. With play being at the centre of our approach, we must think carefully about whether we can justify taking a piece of equipment or activity away from the children or if there are ways of mitigating the risks to make the activity 'safe enough' for the children to still have the play benefits.

Whenever any new piece of equipment or play range is introduced, we have a '**play assembly**' where we celebrate great examples of play, inform the children of any changes, negotiate with the children how we will ensure we stay safe and innovate any existing equipment or rules based on how play has evolved since our last assembly. This gives the children ownership over their 'rules' for safe play, again, giving them an opportunity to have responsibility and developing their awareness of risk and how they manage it themselves.

In the playground we currently have a number of '**ranges**' including the sand pit, digging pit, small world and wheeled play area. These ranges are supervised by our play team who move around their range using dynamic risk management, whereby they observe children's play and intervene if they feel there is an immediate, unacceptable risk. All of the play team staff are trained in dynamic risk assessment as well as the risk benefit approach. The field has been an amazing addition to our play offer and for the first time in our school's history has been open all year! Thank you for your support in ensuring children were equipped to play in all weathers, I can honestly say that the children are also incredibly grateful as it has enhanced their play experience immensely.

This all contributes to the **many benefits** we have seen which include but are not limited to: better behaviour at break and lunch times; children mixing with a wider range of peers; more learning time in the afternoons due to our free flow lunch and trickle in tidy up time; children who are more focused and ready to engage in lessons; and perhaps most surprisingly, less injuries and requirements for first aid! Whilst the children will inevitably have some small scrapes and bumps, they are becoming more resilient in dealing with these themselves, please do however be reassured that all first aid needs are dealt with by trained staff.

Thank you to all of the **Class Reps** who were able to join us at the meeting last week and for coming into school at lunch time this week. I hope you enjoyed the play you saw and feel better informed on the programme and strategies we use in school.

We are hoping to further develop our play offer to include water play, mud kitchen, more wheeled play, a stage for performances and a quieter space with modelling, books and board games for children to enjoy.

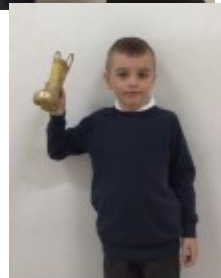
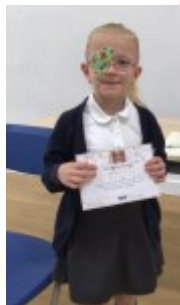

What have we been learning in Nursery?



We have had a wonderful fortnight in Nursery! We have read Oliver's Vegetables by Vivian French and spent this week learning about Easter traditions. We had a great morning tasting all the different vegetables that Oliver tries in the book. Ask your child, which was their favourite? We tried cabbage, beetroot, peas, carrots, spinach and then had a couple of chips!

We have been learning about Easter traditions, decorating eggs and went for a lovely spring nature walk on the field. The children have enjoyed the sunshine and we have swapped some outdoor resources between Daisy and Poppy class so that all children can explore everything we have.

In Maths, we have been exploring positional language and talking about 'in front', 'behind', 'next to', 'above' and 'below' – please keep practising these prepositions over the holidays as the children are getting very good at identifying where things are in relation to each other.

What have we been learning in Reception?



We have had an incredibly busy last two weeks of term in Reception and really enjoyed meeting with parents last week to share all the children's fantastic achievements this year.

English

Last week we continued to share the story *Mrs Armitage on Wheels* and enjoyed a fantastic scooter day. The children used their labelled designs to create wonderful additions to their scooters using junk modelling. They finished the day with a lap around the big playground to share their creations!

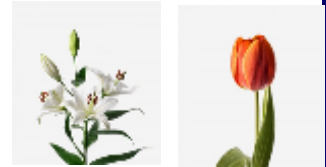

What have we been learning in Year 1?



What an amazing term we have had! In year 1 we have been so busy learning about different big cats, what they look like, what they eat, where they live, and we have even made our own Big cat poster of our favourite one.

In English we have learnt about what a non-chronological report looks like. We looked at the features and labelled them ready so we could make our own Top Trump cards about Big cats. After that we created our own big cat poster making sure we had all the features such as, a title, a picture, subheadings and interesting facts.

In Maths we have been learning how to find half and quarters of shapes and amounts. We will continue to practice this throughout the rest of the year. We have also done position and direction where we learnt the different between whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns including the difference between left and right.

We had a great afternoon this week creating our own junk modelling pets. The children worked in pairs or teams to make their own pet. We were also so lucky to have some Year 5 children join us to help. We all had a great time!

Next term our topic is Dinosaurs! Have a great Easter break and we look forward to seeing you back for term 5.

As we come to the end of a busy and exciting term, we wanted to share some of the fantastic learning your children have been doing in Year 2.

English: We've been working hard to finish our innovated stories, using everything we've learnt this term, and it was lovely to see so many expanded noun phrases, exclamation sentences and conjunctions being used. The children have shown off their incredible writing skills in their *Hot Task* – we are so proud of their creativity and effort!

Maths: In Maths, we've been diving into fractions, learning how to find thirds and two quarters of shapes, amounts and numbers. We've also been exploring how one half and two quarters are equivalent – a big idea that everyone tackled with enthusiasm and understanding.

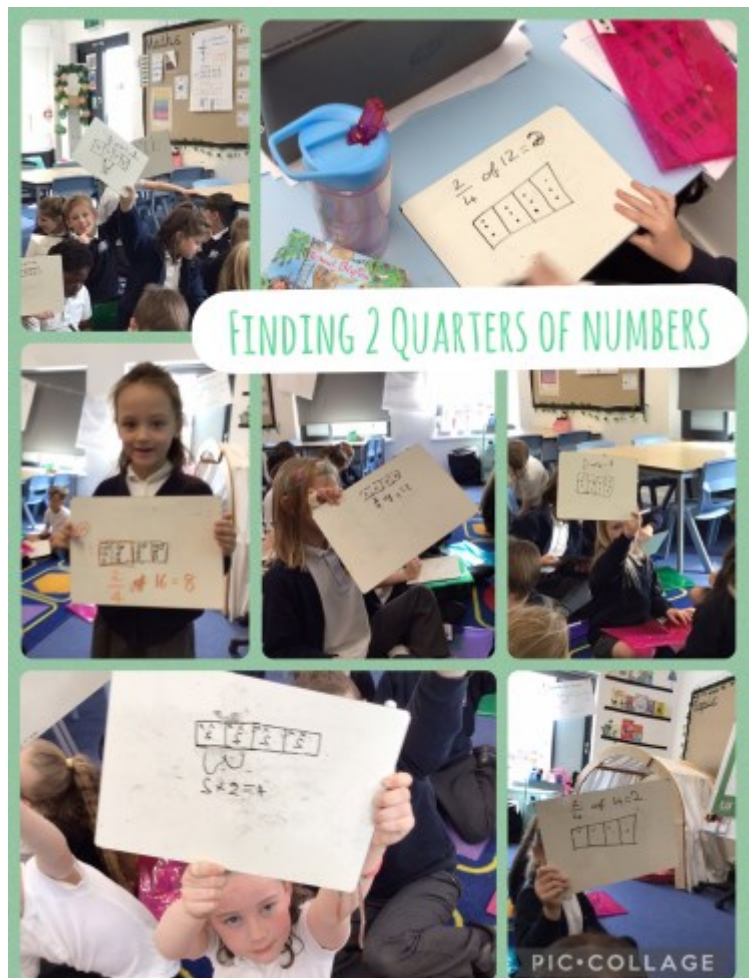
Topic: This week, we've been exploring our local area using Google Maps. The children loved identifying geographical features and learning more about the place they call home. It's been a great way to bring geography to life!

What have we been learning in Year 3?



What a term it has been! The children have been incredibly busy all term and we definitely ended on high with our KS2 Spring Games last week. The children have definitely earned themselves a long and relaxing break for Easter!

We've had a great couple of weeks learning about local rivers and writing non-chronological reports on the River Ray or Thames. We used a model text all about the Amazon River, which links to our class novel, My Name is River. Our topic has continued with a practical lesson looking at Hydro power where the children made their own water wheels!

We have also completed two wonderful art pieces this term which we hope you were able to see at open house. These pieces have been a work in progress for most of the term and the children have taken great pride in them.

We completed our assessment on money, multiplication and division and wow it was a tough one! We will be moving on to finding fractions of amounts and time after easter, so we will ask that whatever time you can find to encourage the children to engage with Times Tables Rock Stars will really support and boost their learning next term.

In RE and PSHE we have been learning about the Easter story and ways to keep our bodies healthy. We have looked at healthy diets and the impact of exercise on our bodies and also how to avoid situations which could potentially cause us harm. In Music we have begun learning to play along to music with the glockenspiel! This will continue next term and we are hoping to develop the children's awareness of tempo and composition further.

It has been an amazing term and the whole team would like to thank you all for your continued support with the children's learning. We hope you all have a lovely easter break and look forward to seeing you all on the other side nice and refreshed!

What have we been learning in Year 4?



What a fabulous finish to the term :)

We've enjoyed our potions topic this term with lots of science, art and writing!

Last week, we learned about medicines used throughout history and modern medicines used today, comparing their ingredients, their effectiveness and whether they were considered medicines or 'potions'. Mr Paget also led a science lesson investigating gases in the products we use in our daily life and the purpose of the gases in them.

The children have produced some impressive artwork, designing a drawing that would incorporate melted wax. Miss Deakin showed the children how angling a hairdryer in different ways could create different effects when melting the wax and the children have been delighted with their finished pieces.

As well as our wax-melting art, the children have produced artwork inspired by their potions poetry. We have been learning about the famous witch's poem from MacBeth, identifying the key features and reciting it. Then, we carefully planned our own potion poems following the structure of the model text. It was tricky to ensure the poems rhymed but the children did a fantastic job!

In maths, we finished our work on short division with confidence and moved on to identify and compare different angles. The children are confident differentiating between acute, obtuse and right angles and can put them in size order.

To finish off our term, the children have worked in groups to make bath bombs – weighing their ingredients and adding extra ingredients such as food colouring and essential oils to personalise their creations.
