Sickness and Diarrhoea

As you will be aware from yesterday's email, there are many children who have been off school this week with sickness and diarrhoea. Some parents have asked about the actions we have been taking to prevent the spread of germs and they are as follows:

- Ensure 48 hour exclusion rule
- Liquid soap and paper hand towels available at all hand wash basins
- Staff to check, encourage and supervise hand washing for children
- Both Reception classrooms have been deep cleaned—hard toys have been disinfected and soft toys have been removed and washed
- Appropriate waste disposal systems have been in place for infectious waste
- Staff have worn disposable, protective clothing when children have been unwell
- Soft toys, water and sand play and cookery activities have been suspended

Packed Lunches

We cook school dinners on site and the children love the variety of meals that are on offer. As a healthy school, we aim to provide the children with a well-balanced meal at lunch time, along with a healthy snack, which is provided by the school at break time.

As a school, we hope parents will encourage their children to try the school lunches. We provide a range of meals, including a main meat meal, vegetarian meal, jacket potatoes or sandwiches. These are all followed with a pudding. Hot dinners can be easily booked online using the parent pay app, where you can pick and choose what your child has for lunch each day.

As all parents and carers are aware, a healthy meal is important because it will help children to:

- Be fitter and healthier now and later in life;
- Learn quicker and show positive behaviours;
- · Maintain a healthy mental health, leading to a happier life;
- Maintain good oral health.





Where lunch provided by the school is not possible, a child's pack lunch could include:

- One portion of pasta salad, sandwich, bread roll or pitta bread.
- Cooked meat, cheese or egg as a filling in a sandwich.
- One portion of fruit and vegetables e.g. carrot/cucumber sticks, apple, banana etc.
- One portion of yoghurt or cheese.

Examples of a good packed lunch

Example 1-Ham/cheese/egg/pasta/tuna sandwich Yoghurt Apple/banana/grapes (cut up) Rice cakes/moat loaf Example 2-Pasta pot Cheese squares Carrot sticks/Orange/grapes (cut up) Rice cakes/malt loaf

School kitchens must adhere to very strict nutritional guidelines about what can and cannot be included in school meals. This includes any salt, sugar and saturated fats. This means that although the children will have puddings or cakes for example, these are sourced and cooked in a healthier way and are presented as part of a balanced menu over the week.

Therefore, to clarify our rules for packed lunches, they cannot include any:

- Nuts (to safeguard those with allergies) this include; nutella, pesto, peanut butter and chocolate spread.
- Sweets and chocolate bars
- Cakes

Thank you so much to all the generous parents/carers and children who have donated games and resources for our Nurture Nest space. These have been very gratefully received by the staff and children!



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Year 1 - Lily and Tulip Classes

What have we been learning in Year 1?

Wow, what a crazy few weeks we have had in school. Tulip and Lily class have been super busy with their learning and practising our Nativity with Year 2, we can't wait to share it with you.



In Maths we have been exploring part, part whole with the number 5 seeing which different ways we can make it. We then had a go at writing number calculations using the symbols + = using our number fact of 5. This week we have been finding and representing all subtraction number fact of 5 using the symbols = -. The children have come up with some great ways of representing these using the Numicon. Finally, we finished our week with portioning 6 using our part, part whole model that we used last week.

In English we have been busy innovating our story 'The Queen's hat' changing the character, object and setting. The children had to think of a new character and an object that blew off in the wind and decide where it was going to land. They used their amazing adjectives to describe these and have finished off the week with writing their own innovated story. Great work Lily and Tulip class!

In Topic we were Geographers, looking at London City, it's Landmarks and exploring them on Google Earth. The children had some lovely knowledge of London and were able to talk about their own experiences of visiting London and many landmarks. Finally, this week we have began to look into the Great Fire of London. The children have enjoyed learning about the Great Fire and recording it's timeline. We have made our own houses from 1666 and discussed the similarities and differences between houses then and houses now.

Reminders:

- Please ensure your child wears a winter coat to school. The children do go outside to play and need a warm coat.
- Library books these are changed each week, but the day may vary. The children are given the option if they would like to change their book if they have finished reading it at home. Please make sure the book is kept in their book bags to ensure if they are given the opportunity to change it they have it with them.

 December in a named bag.

Year 2 have been working so hard over the last 3 weeks. We would like to say a huge well done to all the children for their excellent behaviour last week whilst our visitors were in school. They made us very proud, and as a result we celebrated them all in Gold book assembly last week.

English- We are almost at the end of our talk for writing unit! We just have the final paragraph to write and some edits to make. The children have worked so hard and have done a brilliant job, their stories are full of expanded noun phrases, commas in a list and '-ly' openers. We can't wait to show you at open house next week.

Maths – Over the last few weeks we have been learning how to subtract using a variety of methods. We have been separating 2 digit numbers into tens and ones as well as rounding and compensating. We are continuing to develop our fluency and reasoning skills each day, lots of the children are becoming more independent which is fantastic to see.

Topic – The children have loved our mini cardboard box project! First the children had to

design their guitar before creating and most importantly playing them. The next stage is to evaluate our product, to see if we would need to make any changes if we were to make them again. We hope you have enjoyed the guitars at home as much as we have!

Nativity- Practice is well under way and the children are working hard to perfect their lines, dances and songs. We are looking forward to performing very soon! In the meantime, please continue to practice at home and ensure your child has brought their costumes in, in a named bag.

What have we been learning in Year 3?

Over the last few weeks, we have been focusing on the book 'Escape from Pompeii' in English lessons. We have worked hard



on writing our own setting descriptions using the book as a model. We started the week by writing the setting description of Pompeii before the deadly eruption, before moving on to writing a description of Pompeii during the eruption. In our descriptions we used onomatopoeia, similes and personification!

In Maths, we have worked our socks off on our multiplications, 3,4 and 8s. We learnt lots of multiplication facts to help us with recalling our times tables! We have also used our multiplication facts to learn the corresponding division facts too. Come and ask us to tell you a fact as we love to share these!

In our RE lessons this term we have been discussing what Christmas means to not only us, but the world around us. It has been really interesting listening to each other's family traditions for the festive period and learning about how Christians celebrate it within their communities. We were very proud of how respectful everyone was whilst listening to people's different stories. Take a look at some of our freeze frames showing our favourite family traditions.

We are very much looking forward to showing off our beautiful singing at the Carol service. Please remember our performance for Year 3 families to attend is Monday 11th December,

2pm. The Year 3 Team!








Year 3 - Honeysuckle and Rose Classes

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Year 4 - Apple and Blackberry Classes

What have we been learning in Year 4?



We have already had an action-packed term between our new

learning, preparing for our Christmas Carol Concert and our special visitors. The children have been working hard to learn the songs and their lines for the Carol Concert. They are sure to put on a great show for you all.

In English lessons, the children wrote some fantastic recounts and were able to apply many of the newly taught skills. We have now moved on to writing non-chronological reports. We are currently learning about the different features that make a good non-chronological report such as headings and sub-headings, paragraphs, topic language and present tense verbs. They will then use all of these features to write a non-chronological report about a mountain that they have learned about in Geography.

In Maths, the children have learned a number of new times tables as well as some of the rules around multiplication. Please continue the times table practice with children at home as they are becoming more and more fluent with them. We are now looking at addition and subtraction, expanding on what they learned in Year 3 to 4-digit numbers.

In Science, the children have continued their work on circuits and have been conducting different investigations. First, children investigated how changing different elements in the circuit, such as the amount of batteries, would then effect the bulb. After this, children then investigated what materials make good conductors by adding them into their circuits and seeing whether it would still work.

In Geography, children have been learning about different mountains and mountain ranges. They have also learned how mountains are displayed on a map through the use of contour lines and how this shows height and steepness. They are going to take this learning forward next week when they work as a group to construct a model of a chosen mountain range.
