Dear Parents and Carers,

Teacher Strikes

As you will be aware there has much in the media around Teacher strikes.

One of the teaching unions, the NEU, has voted for a series of strikes on 1st Feb, 2nd March, 15th & 16th March.

The strike action is directed at the Government and at successive underfunded pay awards which now lag significantly behind the rate of inflation and in no way reflects upon the commitment of our Teachers to the education of your children.

Although many Teachers agree with the reasons behind the strikes, within our school, Teachers are in 3 different unions and currently only Teachers in the NEU union can strike.

How will strike action affect William Morris?

When a strike takes place, those taking strike action stop work and withdraw their labour. This means that those teachers involved in the action will not teach their class or undertake any other duties on a strike day.

We therefore have to consider the impact the industrial action will have on the operation of the school. One of the key issues is to assess whether there are sufficient staff available for the school to remain open, or partially open, during a strike.

Part of this will be a risk assessment to consider the impact that the action will have on the health and safety of pupils and staff, and whether the school can run a full or amended curriculum, to determine whether it is possible to operate the school safely during the strike.

Clearly this is a difficult situation, which will cause some disruption. I would ask you, however, to be understanding. A national strike by teachers is *very* unusual. Taking strike action is not something that any teacher would undertake lightly. Those on strike will have thought long and hard about their decision and will also lose pay for the days that they are on strike.

Currently all other classes will be open.

Pupil Premium Children—Packed lunches will be made and given to children who receive pupil premium funding whose classes are close. These will be distributed the day before the strike. School lunches, After School Club and Breakfast Club booking will automatically be cancelled and money credited to your Parentpay account for those children whose class is not open on Wednesday.



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Wellbeing Survey Results

As part of our Safeguarding Audit, we survey the children's feeling about school. We have looked at the results and shared them with staff and Governors. Some of the highlights were:

- Every child who responded said they had a trusted adult to talk to at school
- 96% of children said they feel safe in school
- 98% of children said they were taught about looking after their physical health
- 96% of children said they were taught about looking after their mental health

After further discussion on times of the day and areas of the school, our actions are to improved our cloakrooms and the playground.

Toilets—We have decided to change toilet use to separate girls and boys in Reception, Year 1, Year 2 & Year 3. The children have attended an assembly this week about this information. If groups of children go to the toilet, they will be accompanied by an adult.

<u>**Playground</u>**—We have currently shut the tunnel area and children will only be allowed to play football with adult supervision. We have new playground activities led by an adult eg balance bikes, netball, football, jenga & quiet area.</u>

We hope these will aid children's wellbeing at school.

Upcoming Works on William Morris Way

Swindon Borough Council are in the process of introducing a School Safe Environment Zone (SSEZ) for William Morris Primary School. The SSEZ is the Council's approach to delivering road safety and congestion improvements for schools across Swindon to encourage behavioural change and improve safety.

Work will be carried out on William Morris Way, close to the school entrance. Please see the summary of details about the work in the table below. This will be effective from the first day back after February half term (20/02/2023). Elements of this program could be affected and delayed by adverse weather conditions.

As part of this initiative, a funded scooter pod will be ready to use from Tuesday 31st January at the front of the bike shelter on the Churchward side. The pod will have holes for scooters to be secured with locks. We hope your children can make use of this or seek alternative modes of transport to school including parking away from the school and walking the remaining distance.
